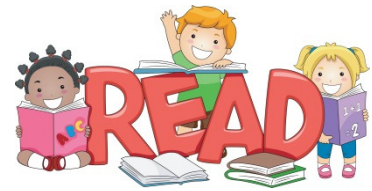


Common Exception Words

This half term your child will continue to bring home 8 tricky words to practise spelling, these are words that can't always be spelt phonetically and just have to be learnt by looking and practising. I would like them to practise them using the following method: look-say-cover-write-check and correct if needed. There is a section on the given sheet for them to practise them several times each week. These words will be sent home on every Friday, with their homework and assessed the following Friday as a simple spelling test. The words that will be sent home are specific to Year 1 from the National Curriculum expectations. At the end of the half term I'll send home a copy of our spelling scores so you can see how well your child has done.

Reading

May I take this opportunity to thank you for all the fantastic reading you are doing with your child at home, regular practise really does support your child's progress in reading. Discussing what your child has read and posing questions to check their understanding is beneficial too. Could I also ask that you sign your child's book so we know whether or not to change it, if it isn't signed we have to assume that your child hasn't read to you at home. This half term, Mrs Dehgamia and I will not listen to them read their home reader at school, it is purely a book to be shared and enjoyed at home. Each group will work with either myself or Mrs Dehgamia reading a new, unseen text in order to develop reading comprehension skills and exploring other Year 1 reading targets; that are a requirement for the Year 1 standards to be achieved by the end of the year.
