Rapid Lateral Flow tests for households – not for primary aged children

There is now the option for households of school aged children to request lateral flow tests for their families to use within their own home.

These tests are for **asymptomatic testing only** and if anyone is displaying symptoms they should go to a test centre for a PCR test. **They are not intended for use by primary aged children.** Please see the latest DfE statement below:

On advice from Public Health England (PHE), **pupils in primary schools and children in nursery settings are not included in the rapid asymptomatic testing programme**.

PHE has advised that there are currently limited public health benefits to testing primaryaged pupils with lateral flow devices (LFD). In addition, primary-aged pupils, particularly younger children, may find the LFD testing process unpleasant and are unable to self-swab.

We are advising that primary-aged pupils should only be tested if they are symptomatic, in which case their families should follow the <u>guidance for households with possible or</u> <u>confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection</u> and <u>book a PCR test</u> for the child.
