Parent/Governor Elections

We have a vacancy for a Parent Governor which we would like to fill as soon as possible.

We know as parents you are interested in the education of your children. The role of Parent Governor offers the opportunity to be involved in the governance and management of school, to work

together to support St Gabriel's in delivering a quality education to all our children. We need an enthusiastic and willing parent to step forward and fulfil this role.

The Governors work as a team, with the Headteacher, in the strategic planning and management of the school. Their responsibilities include considering and approving the aims and policies of the school, discussing targets for development, setting and monitoring the budget and monitoring the overall performance of the school. Governors are the link between the school and the community and represent all those with an interest in the well-being and overall success of the school. Parents are very important in keeping the Governing Body aware of the views of parents and the local community. They are a vital part of our team.

All Governors are required to attend a Full Governing Body meeting held once per term (3 meetings a year). In addition, Governors may also choose to attend sub committees, including Finance which meets 4 times a year and the Standards and Ethos Committee, which meets 3 times a year.

There is advice and support available to you and training for your new role at no cost to you.

Dinner Money - We ask that you pay for your child's lunches weekly every Friday for accounting purposes. There will be opportunities for you to change your child's menu choices <u>termly</u>. Unfortunately, due to the SchoolMoney system we are unable to make changes to lunch options during the term. If you wish to move your child from packed lunches to school dinners or vice versa we require a weeks' notice.





<u>Medication</u>—We have recently been informed by our school nurse that all allergy medication kept in school **must be prescribed** stating your child's name and required dosage. We have also been informed that any child with an inhaler **must also have it prescribed in a box** <u>and</u> have a spacer kept in school. If either of these changes apply to your child, please ensure you

bring medications/asthma spacers via the school office. A letter will be coming out with more information for those who have declared an allergy or asthma on their child's medication form.

Parking around School—We ask that parents do not stop in the road to drop children off, pull up on the zig zag lines or block residents' driveways. Any concerns with parking can be reported to BlackburnNE.NPT@lancashire.pnn.police.uk. We ask that parents do so independently, not through school.
