Reading

Reading is the key to all learning and your child will read with us in school on a daily basis during Read, Write, Inc. lessons and in the guided reading session first thing in the morning.

I am sure you are also keen to support your child learning to read with fluency, confidence and understanding too, so we ask that Year 2 children read their reading book and library for at least IO-15 minutes every day at home with an adult.

How you can help your child learning this year...

Year 2 is an important year for learning; it is the year when children should become competent and confident in all areas, but particularly in reading, writing and maths. To ensure that the children become the best that they can be, please support them to do their homework. Listen to your child read at home, talk about the books they have read at school, help them with any English or Maths tasks, share the Knowledge Organisers and encourage them to practise the weekly spellings.

Knowledge Organisers

The knowledge organiser is a summary of the key facts and essential knowledge that the children need to help them learn our new topics. This term the children will be given knowledge organisers in science, history and geography. At the end of each topic the children will have a quiz.
