### **Developing understanding of our topic and key vocabulary.**

To support your child's learning in our topic work we send home a subject specific knowledge organiser at the beginning of each new topic. This outlines key learning, facts and vocabulary that we will meet during our topic. At the beginning of each lesson we will refer to these and identify what we will be learning during the lesson and how it fits into our learning journey. It would really help your child if you could share these at home too as at the end of our topic we have a simple quiz based upon our knowledge organiser to show how much they've learnt during our topic.

### Parental Support

Reading at home for pleasure is key at this early stage, please spend time enjoying both their reading book and library book; spend time talking about what they have read, making predictions, describing characters or sequencing the main events and explaining what they liked or didn't like about the story. If you would like to support your child further with their learning, our weekly home learning is a great way of doing that.

## Home Learning

### Activities

Homework is a fantastic way of supporting your child's learning. As last term, each Friday your child will be given their homework which is to be returned by the following

#### **Wednesday.**

Each week they will be given an addition number bond challenge, spellings and a reading challenge to reinforce speedy reading and the sounds taught.

### Reading

As last term your child's reading book should be easy for them to read at home and securely in line with their phonic knowledge. We want this shared reading at home to be a pleasure for both you and your child rather than them struggling to decode every word. We'd like them to read fluently and confidently at home.

### Spellings

This term your child will be given weekly spellings to learn which will be linked to our RWInc phonics programme. Every Friday they will bring home a spelling sheet with a daily space for them to practise saying each word, cover it, write it and then check it. We will have our spelling challenge the following Friday and I'll send home their scores.
